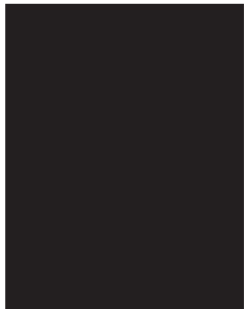

“How Do We Get from *Adopt* to *Adapt*?”

HB 1, the landmark education bill passed recently by the Texas Legislature, mandates a “Course Redesign Project” for entry-level college courses, to encourage efficiency and improve student learning. Some colleges have already begun major overhauls of certain courses. Course redesign is also a national movement with implications for all community and technical college educators.

The law stipulates that new technology must be part of the newly designed format. TCCTA is pleased to present a leading authority on the most effective use of technology in course and learning redesign. *How do we know when learning occurs? How can we distinguish between “right now learning” and “deeper learning”? How does the new “learning environment” work? What are the implications for faculty teaching all subjects?*

These and other important topics will be addressed in this timely interactive session.

Presenting will be Patricia McGee, associate professor of instructional technology and program coordinator for adult and higher education at the University of Texas at San Antonio. Director of several technology and teaching grants, Dr. McGee has most recently worked as research faculty through the Office of Naval Research and the EDUCAUSE Learning Initiative (formerly NLII). She is a popular consultant and presenter.

Also presenting will be Joseph Stafford, assistant commissioner for academic affairs and research at the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board. Dr. Stafford will offer insights into how “course redesign” will be implemented at the state and campus level. With over 30 years of experience as a senior level university administrator, he has also been an assistant professor of civil engineering at MIT and, as a U.S. Army officer assigned to the Office of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, a deployment planner.
