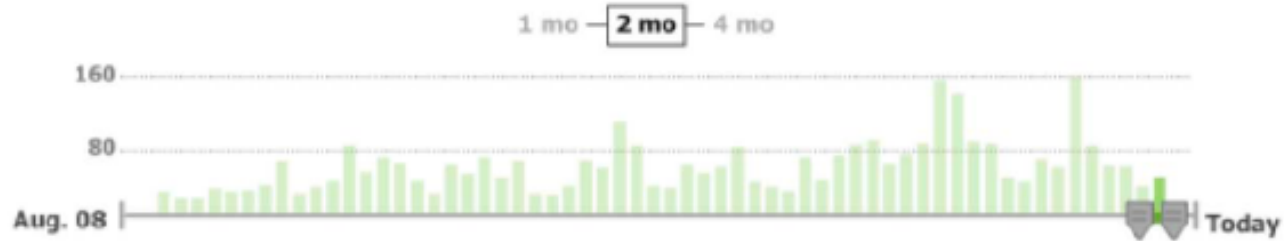


Statistics and Referrers for TCCTA Blog

I like the blog. I get it as an email and I have forwarded several of the topics to others. I don't like blog topics that appear to be trying to sell me something. I think we've only had one of those. For the most part, the blog topics have been perfectly on target.

I signed up for the blog rather late and I LOVE IT. I archive those topics of interest to me and throughout the past month, I would say that 80% of the blog entries have been of interest to me (e.g., textbook pricing, conserving energy, that one blurb about remedial courses "not working," etc. etc. etc.). I feel INFORMED about higher education and community colleges in particular. . . well ahead of my faculty, and often, my administration. Here's my one gripe. I archive the topics I want to keep to an email folder. However, EVERY email SUBJECT is entitled "TCCTA BLOG." I also see TCCTA in the "from" column. It would be helpful if you could translate the SUBJECT: TCCTA BLOG into something specific to the ACTUAL SUBJECT, e.g., "textbook pricing." I could change the subject as I place it in my folder, but (smile) I'd like you to do that for me.

I have nothing but praise for the TCCTA Blog since I subscribed to it. I am a community college board trustee, and I like to stay apprized of the issues and talking points that are generated by the issues. It does help me serve the students, college employees, and the tax payers better. I often send the blogs on to others that the information addresses. I especially like the immediacy of the blogs as the information is sent so quickly after it happened, and it is really the only source of this depth of information.
